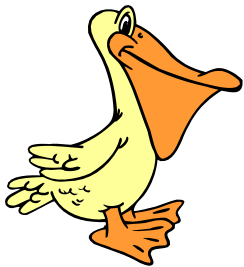


Crossing the road? Which crossing is which?



PEGASUS, now called an EQUESTRIAN crossing. It has 2 control panels - 1 at a normal height for pedestrians or dismounted riders and another 2m above the ground for mounted riders. The green and red men pictograms are replaced by horses. It has a safety fence and the crossing is generally wider to give more room and to keep horses further away from the traffic.



PELICAN, Pedestrian Light Controlled Crossing. Activated by pedestrians when they press buttons on wait the box. They need to ensure all traffic has stopped before they cross and only do so when green man has lit up. No crossing if green man flashes. Also a bleeper sounds when safe to cross for blind and partially-sighted.



PUFFIN, Pedestrian User Friendly Intelligent Crossing. Activated by pedestrians. Red and green signals above wait box. In-built sensors detect pedestrians waiting and ensure vehicles traffic stays stationary until pedestrians have crossed. Also a bleeper sounds for blind and partially sighted.



TOUCAN, or two can, both pedestrians and cyclists can cross. Activated by button on wait box. Sited where cycle routes cross roads. Cyclists can ride. Green and red cyclist pictograms as well as men signals. Sensor operated. Drivers must wait for green light before proceeding.

ZEBRA, I think we all know this one!
